Table 2 \**Mental Health Code*, Section 330.1100b(15). \***MHP** refers to a Mental Health Professional: An individual trained and experienced in the area of mental illness developmental disabilities and who is one of the following: a physician, psychologist, registered professional nurse licensed or otherwise authorized to engage in the practice of nursing, licensed master's social worker licensed or otherwise authorized to engage in the practice of social work at the master's level, licensed professional counselor licensed or otherwise authorized to engage in the practice of counseling, or a marriage and family therapist licensed or otherwise authorized to engage in the practice of marriage and family therapy. \***QIDP** refers to a Qualified Intellectual Disability Professional: Individual with specialized training or one year experience in treating or working with a person who has intellectual disability; and is a psychologist, physician, educator with a degree in education from an accredited program, social worker, physical therapist, occupational therapist, speech-language pathologist, audiologist, registered nurse, registered dietitian, therapeutic recreation specialist, or a licensed or limited-licensed professional counselor.
